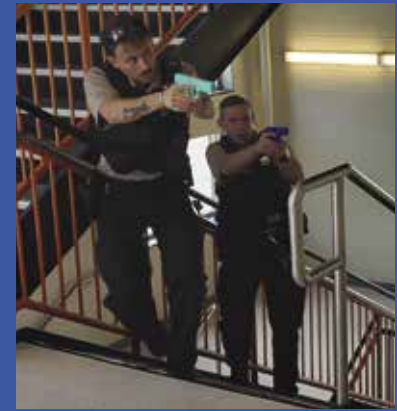

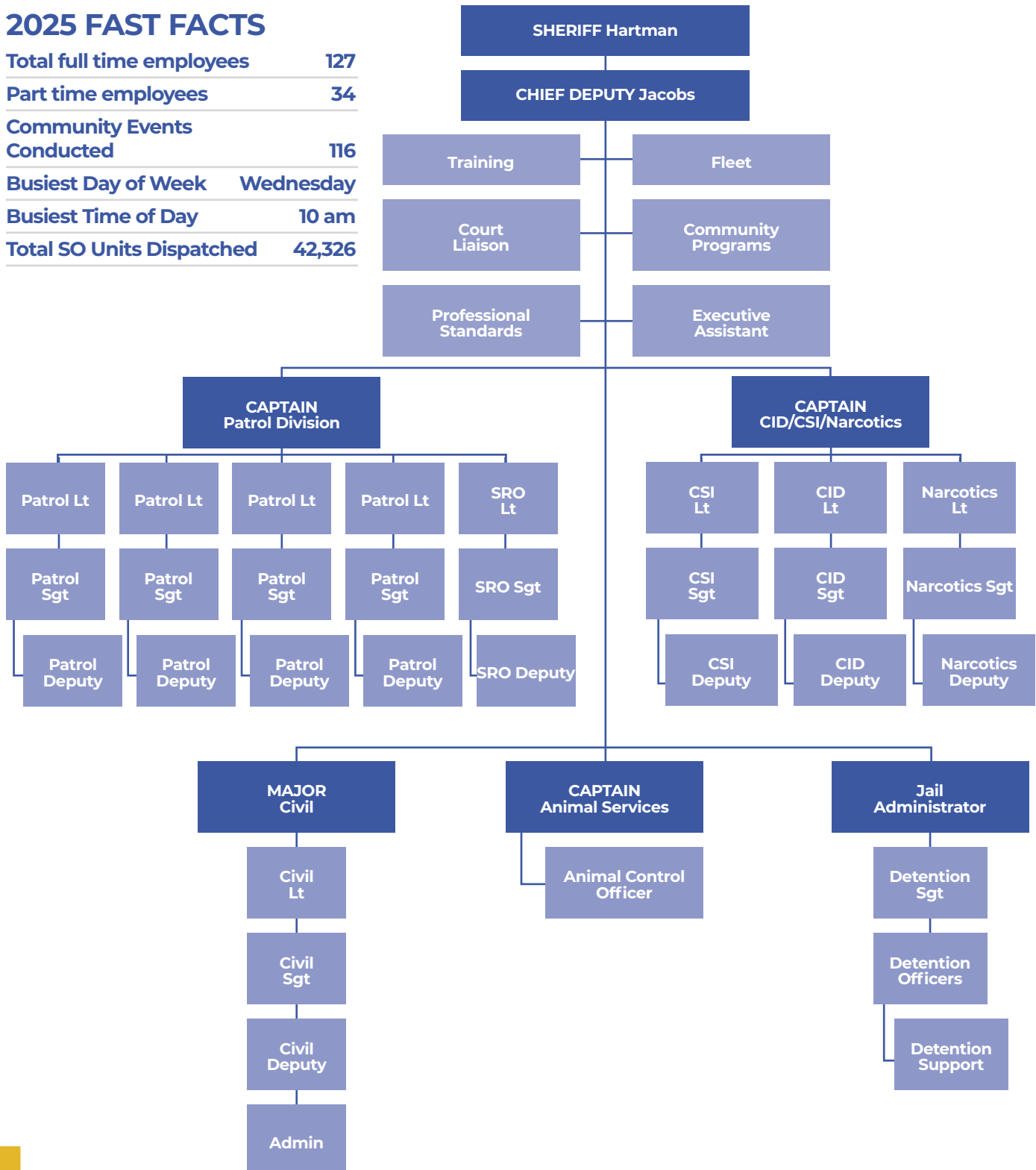
# DCSO Demographics

# Finance



The Davie County Sheriff's Office operates as three units:

### Enforcement Services

Includes all patrol, investigation, civil, court, fleet, and administrative divisions of the office.

### Detention Services

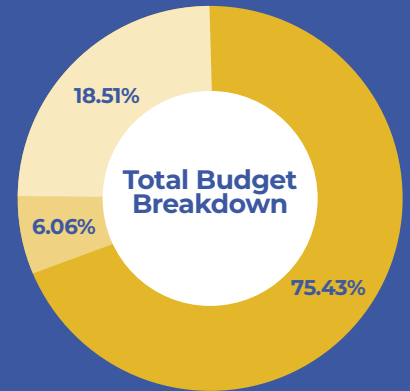
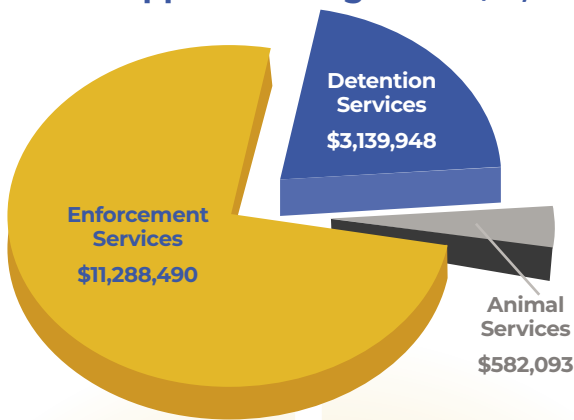
Includes all jail operations and inmate transportation.

### Animal Services

Includes all services related to animal control and shelter operations.

The budget is requested as a single budget for the Sheriff's Office and approved by the County Commissioners as part of the County's overall budget. This approved amount is then divided into three budgets for accounting purposes.

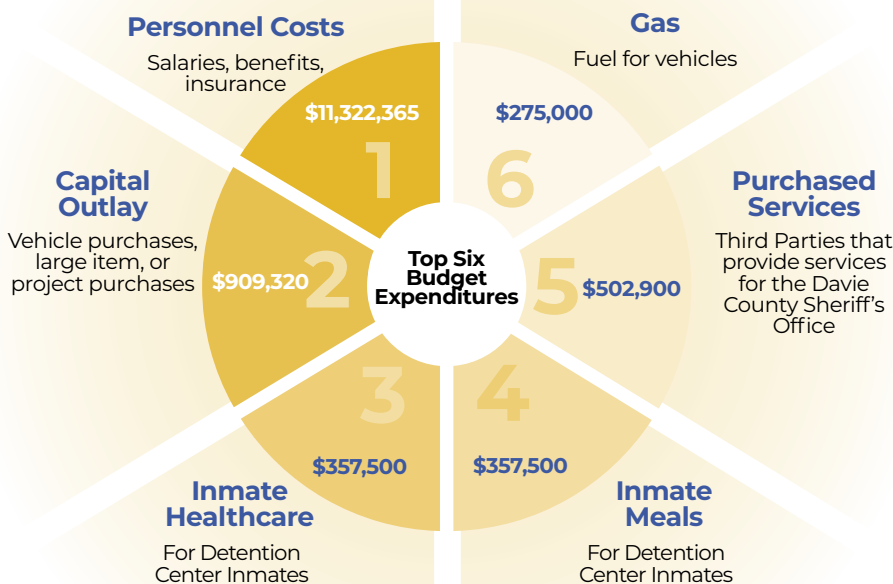

## Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD)



Computer Aided Dispatch, or CAD, records all dispatch activities by DCSO personnel. These include 911 calls, but also activities where personnel self-initiate calls, such as traffic stops or paper service. CAD activities are classified based on information provided by the caller or deputy. Once deputies arrive on scene, that call may be turned into a case requiring further investigation and possible charges, or a referral to a community resource, or it could be handled on scene and closed out.

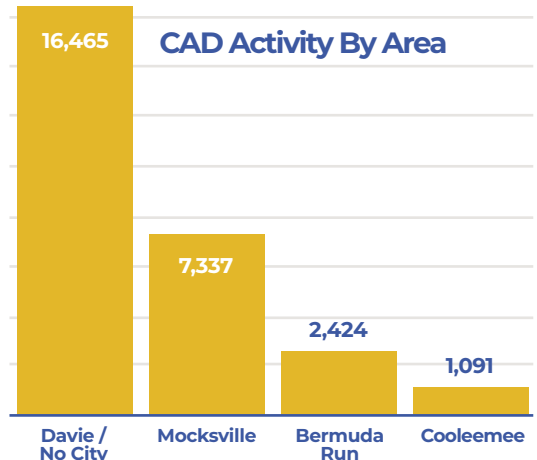
In 2025, Davie County Sheriff's Office handled a total of 27,317 CAD activities, dispatching 43,326 Sheriff's Office units. The busiest day of the week was Wednesday and the busiest time of the week was 10 a.m.

## Criminal Investigation Division



Criminal Investigation Division (CID) is led by a division Captain and encompasses several investigative units within DCSO including **Detectives, Intelligence, Narcotics, Crime Scene, and Evidence**. The men and women of CID have experience and training to develop leads, process and analyze evidence, and compile information to successfully prosecute those who commit crimes.

Narcotics is a specialized unit whose primary responsibility is to enforce violations of the law involving the possession, use, manufacture, sale or distribution of controlled substances. Members of this unit are also called up to assist with other investigations and operations that require their specific skills and training. In addition, the DCSO Narcotics Unit also works closely with other local, state, and federal agencies in matters involving the trafficking of illegal drugs into Davie County and the surrounding areas.

Davie County Sheriff's Office is proud to have the ability to process scenes using a variety of state of the art tools. These tools, which include a **TRIMBLE scanner** (provided by a grant), **drones**, a **digital crimes lab**, and an **in-house CSI lab** and **evidence bay**, allow DCSO to process many types of evidence in the field and onsite.

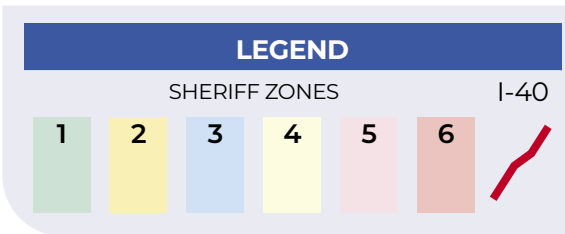
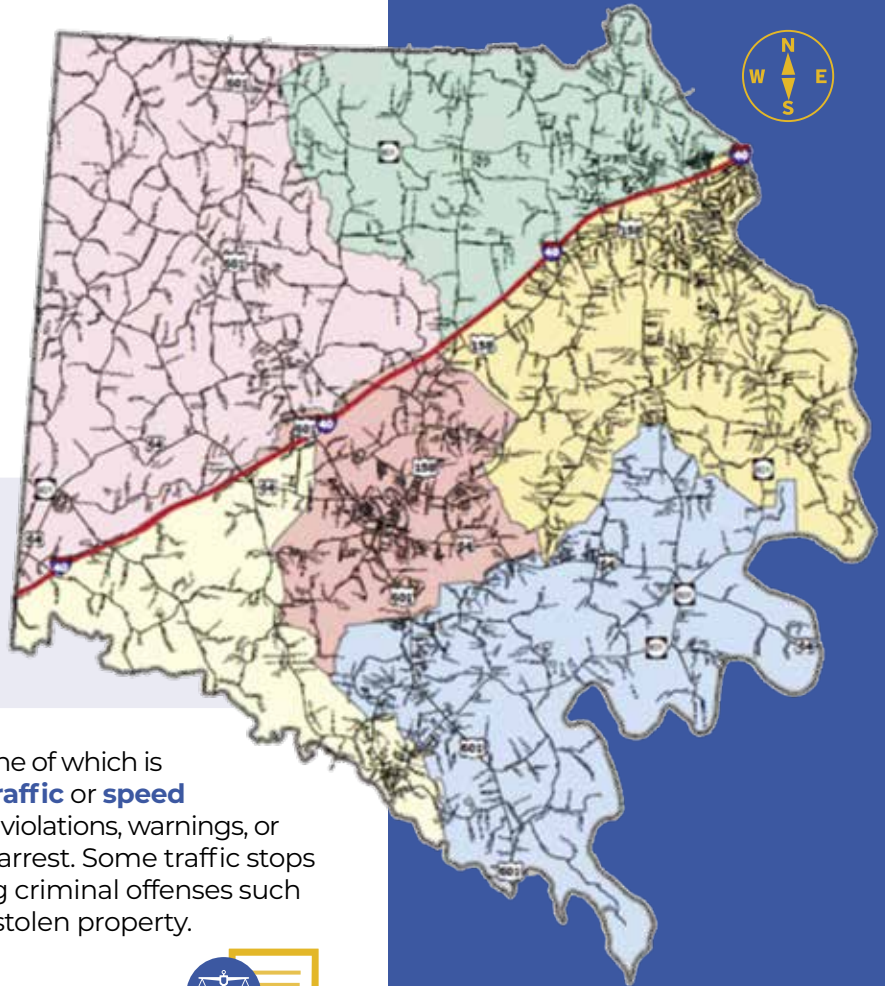


# Patrol Division



The Patrol Division is our largest division, led by a division Captain and composed of **48 deputies** that serve the Davie County community. These deputies patrol the **276 square miles** of Davie County and serve the almost **43,000 citizens** that live in the county, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Our office has divided the county into six zones, which also contain sub-zones, to ensure timely responses.



Patrol services include a range of activities, one of which is conducting **traffic stops** and **addressing traffic or speed violations**. The graph below indicates traffic violations, warnings, or misdemeanor charges that did not require arrest. Some traffic stops result in reports for other matters, including criminal offenses such as wanted persons, possession of drugs or stolen property.

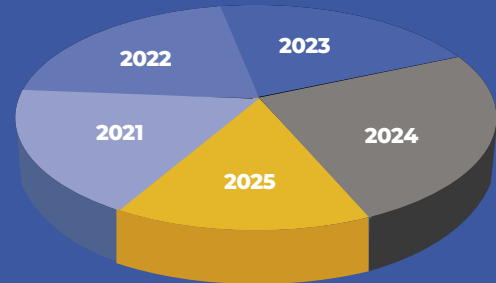

## Civil Division

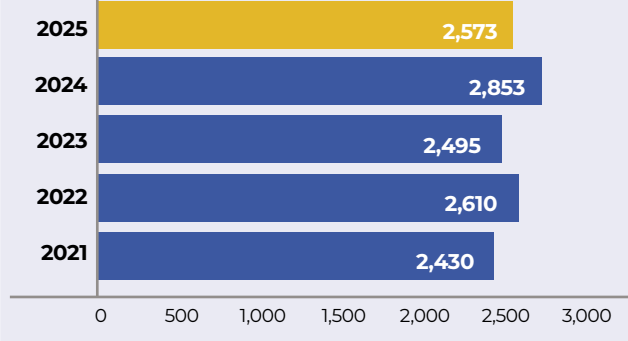

The Civil Division works hand in hand with the court to serve civil process of documents such as:

- Notices
- Civil & Criminal Subpoenas
- Orders (including Domestic Abuse)
- Foreclosures

The **Davie County Detention Center** is an **adult facility that is a medium security** level jail. The facility primarily houses inmates awaiting court dates for trial, but also houses inmates serving sentences of 6 months or less.

The officers, staff, nurse and counselor at the Davie Detention Center are dedicated to **upholding the rights of all people** in our facility.

## Animal Services



Davie County Animal Services is responsible for maintaining the Davie County Animal Shelter, including animal **adoptions**, and for all animal related **investigations** within the county. Service calls involving animal related complaints, injured pets, or rabies control are investigated by our personnel.

Davie County Sheriff's Office is committed to **employing new technologies** and tools to assist with law enforcement and criminal investigations. Currently, DCSO has **18 drones**, mostly smaller models, used primarily by patrol squads, and one large model, which is used primarily by the crime scene investigation units. Our drones are often used to aid in foot or vehicle pursuits, to aid with location of missing persons, to assist in processing a crime scene, or for safety monitoring at community events. We have **14 certified drone pilots** within the office.

Other cutting edge technologies used by our office include the **TRIMBLE scanner**, **Crime-Lite Auto** and **TruNarc**. The TRIMBLE scanner captures a 3D-rendering of a location and is useful when mapping evidence in a crime scene. The Crime-LITE Auto is a specialized camera that uses different spectrums of light photography and can allow investigators to see and photograph otherwise invisible wounds, such as deep bruising. The TruNarc is a handheld narcotics analyzer that allows for rapid identification of narcotics and controlled substances, including key drugs of abuse and emerging threats like fentanyl.

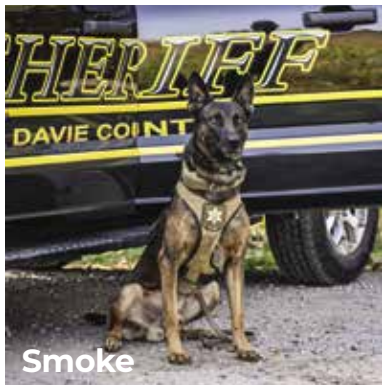
Several of these tools were obtained through grants or with the cooperation of elected representatives. **Senator Steve Jarvis** and **Representative Julia Howard** assisted with funding for the drone program. The TRIMBLE scanner and the Crime-Lite Auto were purchased using grant funding provided by the **Davie Center for Violence Prevention**.



The Sheriff's Office continues to pursue ways to better serve the citizens of Davie County using available resources and technologies.

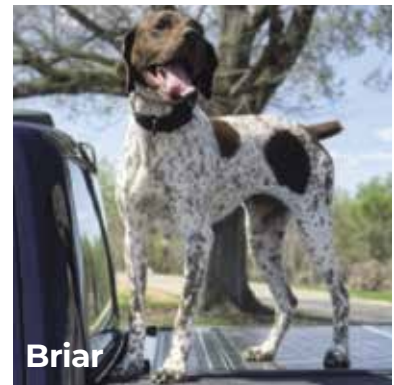


**K9**

Davie County Sheriff's Office is proud to have two K9 dogs, **Smoke** and **Briar**, each trained with different specialties. K9 Briar is new to DCSO and still in training. K9 Smoke is a three-year-old Belgian Malinois from Poland and is a full patrol canine trained in tracking, article search, apprehension and narcotics. Their handlers, Sgt. Beck and Deputy Gobble, respectively, work with each other and surrounding agencies to ensure their K9s are well-trained for their important jobs.
